Getting the Most From Your Training Class

I look forward to meeting you and working with both you and your dog. Here are some suggestions to make your learning experience more fun and productive. Your class/session is confirmed when the complete registration form plus payment in full are received.

What to Bring:

- **A smile** – relax, wag your tail and enjoy some quality training time with your dog.
- **Bring a hungry dog and a full zip lock bag of pea-sized soft meat treats** as training rewards for your dog. A **variety** of healthy meat **soft** treats cut up into **pea-sized** pieces that are valued by your dog will help ensure that you can keep your dog's interest. Adjust your dog's calorie intake for the treats that you feed in class. Your variety might include meat, cheese, hot dogs, dehydrated liver, dog jerky, and a small amount of kibble. Ideally, start feeding a small amount of treats 3 days in advance to adjust to your dog to the food.
- **Proof of vaccinations from your vet is required at the first class.** Puppies must have received two puppy shots prior to the first class.
- **A waist/fanny pack** or pouch that is washable and **dedicated** for treats. Small washable hip/waist packs work very well as they are spill resistant and are easily accessed for quick successful reinforcement.
- **A rug, towel, or bed** for your dog to lie on when they are not working.
- **A tug or squeaky toy** for toy motivation and reward.
- **A flat collar and a leather, nylon or cotton 6 or 4 foot lead.**
Please NO RETRACTABLE or chain leads.

What to Wear:

Wear comfortable clothing. No sandals or low cut shirts.
